This is the main Monkey Land Stage, where various acts are performed, each season.

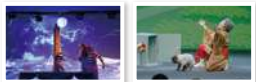
Monkeys and some elite human companions will appear on the stage!

The Monkey Show

The Monkey Show (Sarumawashi), one of the traditional performing arts of Japan, is still being enjoyed as much as ever, today

It is said that these performances reach perhaps even further back in history than 1000 years.

Since ancient times, monkeys have been considered messengers of the gods, and people used to perform Monkey Dances as a form of magic to protect their cattle and horses.

It was believed that monkeys had the power to ward off evil, and help people escape from disasters and illness. This idea perhaps arose from the pro-

nunciation of the Japanese word "Saru" (meaning monkey) that sounds the same as "Saru" (meaning to go away from some place). In the Edo era, monkey trainers were considered to be special workers, and were supported by the Shogunate government.

Then, the Sarumawashi faced a life-or-death crisis.

With the dissolution of the Edo shogunate, these performers lost their important source of support and their numbers declined. Furthermore, a newly imposed Road Traffic Law made it difficult for street performers to operate, due to crackdowns in support of the Law.

Finally, as World War II was looming, such entertainments faded into the shadows and many people forgot all about Sarumawashi for a while.

However, in spite of this, the history of Sarumawashi was kept alive in the hearts of some, who treasured their memories of it and wished to keep the tradition alive. They did not give up, and finally Japan saw a post-war revival of this favorite part of the people's culture.

Using public transportation

Get off at "Kinugawa Onsen Station" on the Tobu Kinugawa Line (about 2 hours from "Tobu Asakusa Station")



From Platform 3 at Kinugawa Onsen Station, take a Nikko Kotsu bus bound for Nikko Edomura. Get off at the "Osaru no Gakko-mae" bus stop.
